### **Minutes**

### **Civic Center Sept. 19, 2017**

- I) The meeting was called to order with the reciting of the Lord's Prayer and Pledge to the Flag.
- II) Roll call was taken with Council President Ciotti, Council Vice-President Kingsley, Council Member Roddy, Council Member Mullikin, Council Member Callahan, Mayor Hamilton, Town Manager Nelson and Attorney Wolking present.
